**▷ DOUBLE FEATURE** A generously proportioned room calls for substantial pieces that will not look lost in the space. In Whistles founder Lucille Lewin's home, a pair of oversized sofas defines the seating area and can accommodate large gatherings of guests. The unusual upholstery, featuring raw-edge seams and fabric-covered feet, helps to draw attention to the characteristic shape.

**◁ PURPLE REIGN** A sofa is a good vehicle for introducing a block of solid colour to a scheme – this piece, upholstered in a rich plum velvet, makes a strong impact in an otherwise pale décor. The unusual design features curved arms, which provide an enveloping feel and help to differentiate the sitting and dining areas of this room. □
